On Christmas Eve we will have two services. The first will be at 5:30 pm and the second at 10:30 pm. At the early service our children's Christmas Program will be during the sermon. I am excited about our children's ministry and thankful to Amy Baker for organizing the program we are using today, and other activities for the children.

St. John's is in a good place as we continue to come out of COVID days and hopefully are able to continue to move forward in growth this year and in the years to come.
