Dear Friends,

One of the many things the Church Canon requires us to do is to file a Parochial Report each year by March 1st. Our Bishop's secretary keeps up with these reports and will not leave us alone until the reports are filed. This is a statistical report that gives us a picture of the preceding year.

As you can imagine, some of our numbers like our average Sunday attendance have gone down due to the virus. From what I can tell, there are three different ways people seem to determine if they are attending worship services during the pandemic. One is that people don't want to attend during a time of wearing masks. Others don't want to attend for health reasons. And others aren't present because they either have the virus or have been exposed to it.

For whatever reason someone may have, our attendance numbers are down and this is understandable for last year and where we are now with the peak on the line graph of the virus. But as the peak goes up so do the number of views on our YouTube video. Through our online streaming we have made many connections with folks who have worshiped here in the past and some new connections as well. There are people watching our services from New Mexico to Iowa to Michigan. Some folks from my former congregation in Brandon watch us as well. The virus has changed us and in some ways for the better.

As these changes are happening our liturgical year hasn't changed. We are in the middle of the Epiphany season. This is a season that reminds us about the manifestation of God in the person of Jesus Christ. The word manifestation means an event, action, or object that clearly shows or embodies something. The idea of God manifesting in us is something that we need to look at and examine and then take action on.

For whatever reason we aren't attending the regular Sunday worship service, there is still a desire to be together which I believe is the manifestation of God calling us in that soft voice to be together and worship Him as a community of faith. What is the manifestation of God in us calling us to do during this Epiphany season and beyond?

This is a question that, if we take it seriously and pray about it, we will serve our beloved St. John's family and God in extraordinary and manifesting ways.

Planning your personal Lenten journey for 2022

The season of Lent begins in less than a month, and many parishioners are beginning to think about how they will observe Lent this year. The first day of Lent is Ash Wednesday, the day on which we gather to receive ashes on our forehead as a sign of our repentance and mortality. As we move toward the beginning of Lent, here are some ways you may want to consider as you decide about your own Lenten journey.

- **REFLECT ON THE CROSS:** Reflect daily on the power of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the meaning of his death on the cross, and the greatness of God's love for you.
- **PRAY DAILY:** Set aside some extra time each day during the season of Lent for personal prayer in the morning and evening.
- **READ THE BIBLE:** Make time every day to read your Bible during Lent. One idea is to read the entire Gospel of Mark, which has a special focus on the cross.
- **GIVE UP SOMETHING:**A common practice for Lent is to give up something—like technology, social media, sweets, coffee, alcohol, etc. This is a great time to detox from things that may have a stronghold in your life.
- START A GOOD HABIT: In addition to giving something up, try doing something good this Lent. Are you a pessimist? Try to be more positive. Are you critical by nature? Make an effort to be more encouraging. Ask the Holy Spirit to help you.

- **GIVE YOUR TIME:** During Lent, give of your time by volunteering in your church or local community.
- **KEEP A JOURNAL:** Keeping a journal of your thoughts, prayers, and reflections during Lent can be a helpful aid to your Lenten journey.
- MAKE TIME FOR YOUR FAMILY: If you have kids, plan special times just for them during Lent. Take your family hiking or on a lunch date, or even have a family day where you can serve together in the community.
- GIVE YOUR MONEY: During Lent, give a little more money to your local church or consider your favorite charity or mission agency.
- **FORGIVE OTHERS:** Lent is a time to make things right in your life and relationships. Is there a person in your life you need to forgive? Don't hold that resentment any longer. Pray about it and ask God to help you forgive them.
