A Barnabas member will be someone who is already a member of St. John's who travels alongside the person seeking confirmation and is there to support them and encourage them. When the confirmand is presented to the Bishop for confirmation the Barnabas member will serve as the sponsor-presenter.

If you would like to become a member of the Barnabas Guild, please let me know. There are lots of opportunities at St. John's and I hope you will participate as we continue our journey together.


Drawdown promises a roaring good time

New book study to begin Aug. 7


All members of St. John's as well as those interested in joining the church are welcome to participate in a new St. John's book study starting August 7.

Thoughts on stewardship

Annual Pledge Drive to begin in October

In a few months, we will have our Annual Pledge Drive. This is a good time to begin to think and pray about your pledge. Here are some of the many reasons why we might be motivated to give to the church.

Some could feel they are paying a "membership fee" and in exchange are receiving something from the church. The "something" could be a deeply moving inspiration, a sense of ensuring the availability of the pastoral offices or to buy entrance into a beneficial moral environment. Some might just want to establish eligibility for other benefits of the church and to know there is a church family for help and support. There is nothing really wrong with wanting any of these things from the church.

Some want to give and see the results of their gifts, perhaps helping those who have a particular need. These people can be referred to as mission-oriented, or sometimes as outreach-motivated. Giving such as this to benefit others is in accordance with the second of Jesus' summary

commandments: "Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself."

The greatest reason to give, however, is for our thankfulness and love of God. In this way we are giving to God in gratitude for what we have received from God. In this idea, one is giving without attention to which of God's purposes the gift will be used for. The giver is turning over control of the gift, even indirect control. When the giver totally releases control, the transfer can really be called a gift. Maybe this type of giver never felt they owned what they are giving away anyway! Prayerfully reflect on this: "All things come of thee, O Lord: of Thine own have we given Thee."

Look for more information over the coming months. St. John's Annual Pledge Drive will begin on October 16 and end on October 30. Each parishioner will receive a letter with a pledge card to either bring to Church or return by mail. Each of us will be challenged to live and give more generously as God has given to us. Please join us in this important endeavor.

We are asking all church members to use the drop box instead of placing items in the


unlocked mailbox across from the door. The drop box provides added security as only Fr. Tom and Jenn have keys, and they check the box daily during office hours.

The drop box is located on the front door of the office and is large enough to hold most documents.


Printed directories should arrive soon
