Dear Friends, September 2022

Over the past few weeks, I have been very encouraged about our attendance during all our worship services and educational programming. All this along with having three acolytes on Sundays has given me a real sense of fullness about where we are now. This, in a way, gives us a vision of where we as a faithful congregation can go in the future.

This growth didn't happen overnight and was certainly slowed down by COVID. But in the last few weeks, we have gotten a glimpse of what is possible for our future. I know I have dreams of what we might look like in the years to come with worship and programming. What we are seeing and experiencing now is a new foundation of growth, and it's a foundation we can build on if we choose to do so.

Next month we will have our stewardship campaign. It is a time when we will all be asked to make a pledge for 2023. In much the same way as we visualize what is possible for us as a community of faith, our pledge drive lets us think about our own role in that future. What are we willing to do individually for the future of St. John's? How much skin are we willing to put in the game as far as our resources go? How excited are we about the future when it comes to our resources? These are questions we can only answer ourselves, but the answer is something we can place on our pledge cards.

More important than this is that what is on our pledge card is about is our personal relationship with God. I like the way my friend Father Furman Buchanan wrote about this relationship in his book, *Gifts of God for the People of God.* When Father Buchanan writes about the offertory part of our service, he puts it in context of where we have been in the service before then and goes on to say what the

offertory really means. Father Furman writes,

"The money, bread and wine are not the first gifts we have offered to God in our celebration of the Holy Eucharist. Our first offering was the prayers of the people, when we gave up the deepest needs and desires of our hearts over which we have no control.

Second, we offer our confession – the thing over which we have some marginal control but still hinges mostly on God's (and our neighbor's) willingness to forgive. Third, we offered the peace of Christ—the gift over which we have mutual control. This offering is fully realized only when we share it with one another.

The offertory then is the culmination of all these offerings. Having already given up to God's mercy the things over which we have no or only marginal control and sharing the gift of peace over which we have mutual control, we now have the opportunity to give the thing over which we have total control. At least we have a chance to offer our power.

That's right! The offertory is about much more than a collection of money! This is the sacred moment when we boldly proclaim our power to make a difference in God's name."

So to turn over our power to God for the Kingdom of God and God's power is what we are called to do during this stewardship season. We do this in the context of a relationship with the one who loves us and cares for us more than we can ever imagine.


