I preached a sermon the other day about helping those on the margins of our society. In that sermon I talked about blessing bags. These are one gallon zip lock bags that will contain essential items to help folks make it through the day and provide information about how they can begin the process of finding a place where they can live so that they will not be in the hot sun and must beg for money and food.

During the sermon I listed a few items that will be placed in the bags, but we are still working on figuring out what items we need to include. Certainly, water and some type of food will be part of the contents. If you have any ideas on what items need to be in these bags please email Jenn and we will consider your suggestions.

The blessing bags are something that I hope you will keep in your car. When you see someone in need you may give it to the person. The encounter doesn't need to be one where you don't feel safe. The last thing I want any of us to do is put ourselves in an unsafe situation. The bags will probably be two to three inches thick so you can keep your window closed and motion for the person to come over to your car and crack the widow wide enough for the bag to be passed through. This way the person in need will receive the bag and you will be able to stay safe.

All you have to say is God bless you when the bag is passed through the crack of the window. The information they will receive to help them

come out of a homeless situation is a card that has the phone number for the Open Doors Homeless Coalition. This is a charity organization that helps homeless people find an apartment where they will be able to begin living a better life. You may look this organization up on their web site at https://www.opendoorshc.org/.

This is one way we can be Jesus' healing presence in the world. As I said in my sermon, these gallon bags of supplies aren't going to make a difference to everyone who is in need but they will make a difference to someone in need! When we read the gospels one thing we will notice is that Jesus healed people one at a time and that is what I believe our mission is with these blessing bags.

It is still my hope that we will be able to make them available to you on All Saints Sunday as we recognize our own sainthood and live into being Christ's Body in our world today.


