Hello and greetings this Eastertide. During Eastertide we experience the resurrection of our Lord. Easter is a time to celebrate as we let go of the old and take on the new. It is the old way of death having the final word and the new way of death as a transition into a new life eternal. This letting go of the old and living the new is something that we must always recognize this time of the year.

The above words were borrowed from last year's newsletter; I chose to use these same words because they truly represent our season from Easter through Pentecost. I also feel they reflect our 'local season' of our Rector Transition process.

During the past two months, there have been many exciting things happening at St. John's. We conducted Stations of the Cross on Fridays during Lent. We enjoyed seafood lunches following the Holy Eucharist on Sundays. During the first few days of Holy week, many of us worshiped in the open and inviting style of Fr. Harold Roberts. These services were followed by soup and sandwiches.

This year, we added foot washing to the Maundy Thursday service, which was a beautiful experience enjoyed by many. We had many volunteers for The Passion readings during Palm Sunday and Good Friday services. Holy Saturday was celebrated with fire and candles which made that service so intimate. The bare alter was adorned with gorgeous flowers. The Easter Sunday celebration began with 'joyful noise' as the younger children began the service by flowering the cross and listening to a kid-friendly lesson. The excitement continued with the Easter Holy Eucharist and confirmed with the joyous congregational noise of raised voices with shouts of "Alleluia, Alleluia"!

Many of you (most behind the scenes) made those services and celebrations exceptional. The service preparations, servers, readers, food, adornments, and the coordination of the services was definitely work from the heart and work in service of our Lord. I have immense appreciation for our parish and all who make up our Church Family.

We are seeing progress in our season of Rector Transition. The Chair of the Search Committee has been selected and nominations for the search committee are in process. Yes, there is still time to nominate or volunteer with receipt of nominee name on or before May 8. We hope to have the committee selected soon.

After committee selection, there will be kick-off meetings and training sessions for both Vestry and the Search Committee. After that, the committee will again turn to all of you and request your input. Your input and feedback is critical to help accurately define our Parish's wants and needs for our future Rector. The input request(s) will come to you in the form of surveys; it is critical that you respond to these surveys to make the process as successful as possible. More to come on that as we begin the surveys.

I'd like to close this letter with a prayer from *The Book of Common Prayer*:

Almighty God, giver of every good gift: Look graciously on your Church, and so guide the minds of those who shall choose a rector for this parish that we may receive a faithful pastor, who will care for our people and equip us for our ministries; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

From the list of nominees and volunteers, the Wardens and Chair of the Search Committee will recommend a slate of six-to-eleven members for the committee, subject to the approval by the Vestry.

Those making nominations or offering themselves for service on the Search Committee should be mindful that it is likely that not all who volunteer or are nominated will be selected for the committee.

FEMA Guide to Hurricane Preparedness

Whether you've lived in the Pascagoula area for years or are new to the area, it never hurts to refresh yourself on the key elements of preparedness. Hurricane season is here once again, and just hearing that could bring about significant stress, especially if you've been through a previous disaster. To combat stress, take action now. Each positive action you take can help you feel better and more in control.

Look for steps you and your family can take to prepare ahead of time for any disaster-related needs. It's time to make a plan today. FEMA suggests that the key elements of any solid plan include:

Communications

Your family may not be together when a storm strikes, so you need to know how you'll contact one another and reconnect if you are separated. Write down your contacts and plans. Print a copy for each member of the family. Make sure everyone in the family has copies and keeps them in a safe place, like in a backpack, wallet, or taped in a notebook. Also put those plans in your cell phones.

Establish a family meeting place that's familiar and easy to find. If you have pets or service animals, think about animal-friendly locations. Consider places in your house, in your neighborhood, and outside of your city or town so you are prepared for any situation.

Supplies

Being prepared for an emergency isn't just about staying safe during a storm or a disaster. It's also about how to stay comfortable, clean, fed, and healthy afterwards. If the power goes out, you may not be able to go to the store or the bank. Being prepared means having your own food, water, cash, and other supplies to last for at least three days, and possibly longer if you are in a remote or hard-to-reach area.

Make a kit

Remember that your kit will depend on your own needs. Include clothing, toiletries, and medications. Once you have the basic items, consider what unique needs your family might have, such as supplies for pets or seniors. See the next page of this newsletter for a checklist you can print and use.

Financial Plans

It is a challenge to rebuild your life after a destructive storm or other emergency. Having access to personal financial, insurance, medical and other records is critical for starting the recovery process quickly and efficiently.

- Gather financial and critical personal, household, and medical information.
- Keep a small amount of cash at home in a safe place. It is important to have small bills on hand because ATMs and credit cards may not work during and after a storm when you need to purchase necessary supplies, fuel, or food.
