The search committee held our second meeting with our search consultant recently where we discussed in detail the current tasks in front of the team. In accordance with the Episcopal Rector Search Manual, the team is currently working to develop a church survey to more deeply understand our parish needs as it comes directly from our parishioners. When the survey document is published to the parish in the upcoming weeks, we are asking for feedback from each and every parishioner because we want every voice to be heard on what is needed in our new priest.

In parallel, we are working to update the parish profile which will be one of the main documents that helps show potential candidates what St. John's is really about. Information from the survey will directly shape the profile and showcase who we are at St. John's. Shortly after the profile is complete, we will then work with the diocese to formally announce our opening to the Episcopal network. It will be then that we begin to review candidate interest and look at next steps.

As we have been told by Bishop Seage and our search consultant, this is a process that takes time, patience and prayer from the parish as a whole. The search committee is appreciative of all the support during our journey to finding St. John's a new rector.
