Happy Fall, St. John's!

September 2023

September 10th was the second Sunday in the Season of Creation, a short liturgical season that runs from September 1 to October 4 attending to the spirituality of creation and a theology of the environment. During this time, Christians and those of other faiths are encouraged to read the Bible with our hearts attuned to the Earth and its inhabitants and our hands ready to participate with God in cocreating the future. The Episcopal Church joins this international effort for prayer and action culminating in the Feast of St. Francis on October 4th.

These suggestions for how we can do our part in helping the environment were offered in the July edition of the Mississippi Episcopalian but are worth repeating here.

Reduce single-use plastics at church:

- Use durable plates, cups, and cutlery for coffee hour, receptions, and meals;
- Purchase kitchen staples such as cooking oil in glass or metal containers and avoid single-use servings (such as small condiment packs);
- Seek out plastic-free alternatives for cleaning supplies.

Reduce plastic at home:

- Skip the bottled water. If you aren't comfortable with tap water, purchase a durable pitcher with a filter (Brita or similar) or install a filter on the kitchen faucet.
- Use a traditional coffee maker avoid plastic coffee pods.
- Keep reusable shopping bags in your vehicle.

- Use wax paper instead of plastic sandwich bags for lunches.
- Switch to bar soap instead of plastic soap dispensers.

It's difficult to change our habits all at once, so consider trying just one or two.

The Feast of St. Francis is celebrated on October 4. St. Francis is the patron saint of animals and the environment and worship inspired by this Feast typically includes pet blessings, prayers for environmental protection and conservation, and a call to a lifestyle based in simplicity and service of others.

This prayer is a good one for today and every day!

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace, where there is hatred, let me sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; and where there is sadness, joy.

O, God, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console;

to be understood as to understand;
to be loved as to love;
for it is in giving that we receive;
it is in pardoning that we are pardoned;
and it is in dying
that we are born to eternal life. Amen.


